Enkindle our hearts with the fire of your love that we may reflect your love to all—especially to those who are still walking in spiritual darkness around us; for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

- **G** for he will abundantly pardon.


(Silently reflect on these words and our need for his forgiveness.)






