Lighting of the Wreath

O Come. All Ye Faithful

(The center white candle and all four candles around the Advent wreath are lit.)

- On this holy night, we light all four candles and the center candle, the Christ candle, on the Advent wreath. The Light of the World has come to make his home with us. Jesus Christ is born!
- Shine through the darkness and light our path to you, O Lord.
- The Son of God humbled himself to dwell with us. The newborn Savior was wrapped in swaddling cloths and laid in a manger in Bethlehem when there was no other place for him. The infant King was welcomed by Mary and Joseph, worshiped by shepherds and praised by angels. Tonight, we join them in glorifying our Emmanuel. To us a Child is born, to us a Son is given!
- **E** Enlighten us, O Lord, with your presence every day of our lives and forevermore.

Confession and Absolution

- P Let us come before our Lord this night to confess our sins:
- O Lord, since Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden, the human race has been sinful, and we know that we are sinners, and we are sincerely sorry for disobeying you in so many ways. We have not followed the Ten Commandments, we have not loved you and others as we ought, we have not respected and honored your precious gifts to us. We kneel at your manger and humbly confess our sins, seeking your forgiveness and love.

Children of God, I have good news of great joy for you today. Because of the birth of the Christ Child who has come to save us, through his death on the cross, your sins are forgiven. Your misdeeds are erased. Your wayward behavior has been taken away forever. You are free to live a new life in his mercy and grace. Amen.

¹The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom like the crocus; ²it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon.
